General Information

All Parents Online Registration/Verification for 2020-2021

Online registration and verification for the 2020-2021 school year opened on February 3! This process must be completed for every student each school year. Please check your email beginning February 3, 2020 for a message from "PowerSchool Registration Support" <noreply@noreply.psrsupport.com> and follow the instructions in that email to complete the registration process.

All parents and guardians are required to complete the registration process by 4:30pm on March 20, 2020. This deadline allows us to determine the eligibility of bus pass applicants, the routing of buses, bus pass production and data verification before the summer break while schools are still







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operating. Any applications received after the March 20 deadline may not be processed in time for the first day of school.

Payment arrangements for bus passes must be received through Parkland School Division's online payment system (Rycor) or at the Parkland School Division Centre for Education on or before Friday, June 26, 2020 for students to be eligible to ride the bus the first day of school. Remember: If your child does not have a valid bus pass for the 2020-2021 school year, they will not be able to ride the bus.

Registered Bus Students Requesting to ride a Different Bus Process

- 1. Contact Transportation Services, at transportation@psd70.ab.ca, a minimum of 24 hours in advance, if your child wants to ride a different school bus (i.e. to go home with a friend) or wants to bring a friend home on the bus.
- 2. Approval will be based on space and availability. Transportation Services will contact the requested bus and determine if the needed space is available for the date requested.
- 3. Parents will be notified via email if the service is available.

NOTE: Students will not be permitted on the bus without prior permission.

Epilepsy is one of the most common, serious, neurological disorders affecting approximately 300,000 people in Canada and 50 million people worldwide.

There are approximately 15 000 people living with epilepsy in Edmonton and Northern Alberta.

Do you know what to do if someone has a seizure? Seizure first aid is a matter of taking precautions.

- * Keep other people out of the way.
- * Clear hard or sharp objects away from the person.
- * Don't try to hold them down or stop the movements.
- * Place them on their side, to help keep her airway clear.
- * Look at your watch at the start of the seizure, to time its length.
- * Don't put anything in their mouth.
- * Call 911

Hot Lunch

At Forest Green, we utilize the "hot lunch system" to email parents about upcoming activities, fundraisers, and special events going on throughout the school year. We encourage you to set up an account at forestgreen.hotlunches.net so you are in the loop with all things Forest Green.

We of course also use this system for HOT LUNCH! Forest Green offers hot lunch on Tuesdays for grades 1-6 that is provided through various local suppliers. The program is entirely web based through the hot lunch system. Menus are emailed out at the start of each month for you to select the food options for your child(ren). Payments will be accepted online only through using etransfer.

How to register on the hot lunch system:

- Go to www.forestgreen.hotlunches.net
- Click on "Click Here To Register"
- > Complete the registration form (*Including your email address will ensure you receive reminders about deadlines, and your child's hot lunch order for the upcoming week*)
- Click the "Register Now" button at the bottom
- Follow the instructions to add each child in your family who attends Forest Green School (Hot lunch is available for Grades 1-6 only)
- ➤ All teachers and grades are posted to match with your child





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- Once your child(ren) are registered, click on "Orders"
- Proceed to order hot lunch for your child(ren)
- Please be sure to read through the policies on the webpage

IMPORTANT NOTE: If you had an account last year you must make a new one, as the system resets each school year to comply with privacy laws.

Community Support Worker News

Community Support at Forest Green School:

Rainbows - Rainbows supports students with family transitions such as loss, grief, separation, and divorce. We currently have two Rainbows groups offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Anger Management - We currently have one anger management group offered on Tuesday mornings. Students will discuss and identify what triggers their anger. Understanding "what lit the fuse"? Makes it easier to manage the feelings and emotions, instead of carrying their anger around which could trigger an explosion. The group is offered over 16 weeks, one block per week.

Self Control Group, or Wiggle Worms - Is offered on Thursday mornings. The objective of the group is to teach children how to self regulate by learning to identify/apply self - control strategies that work for each child, while supporting students in developing skills, strategies and confidence. The group is offered over an 8 week period, one block per week.

Friendship/Social Skills Group - The objective of the group is to teach children how to make and keep a friend, while supporting students to understand the connections with thinking, feeling, and doing. The duration of the group is 12 weeks, one block per week.

Resilience Building What Floats Your Boat? - The objective of the group is to build resilience in children. Students will deepen their understanding of the skills required to help them not to give up when "life's waters get choppy". The duration of the group is eight weeks, one block per week.

As part of our health program we are excited to deliver a program called You Me and We to our grade 5 students at Forest Green School. The objective of the program aims to support students to build a foundation of an age-appropriate understanding of their brain. We will focus on learning what parts of the brain are responsible for how we relate to the world, including our peers.
